C.690 Town Hall Development

Councillors received a presentation on the Town Hall Development from Mr Peter White of Fresh Life Consultancy and Mr Dan Mulligan, Partner, Glenn Howells Architects.

Councillors were updated on the developing plans and emerging issues and took the opportunity to ask questions of the project manager and of the architect. Councillors expressed their concerns about the plinth design, absence of office space for Town Council staff the potential for the projected costs to exceed the available funds and whether the projected completion date was achievable.

Mr White reported that, having reflected on earlier feedback and comments from councillors, the architects have agreed that the stained glass window (installed to mark the coronation of the present queen) in the King Charles Room should stay in situ and that a design should be commissioned for the new window of similar size proposed for the redesigned space and should mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Mr White suggested that the cost of this might be raised by public subscription and urged any councillor who would be interested in heading up the campaign to raise the sum required (in the region of £50k - £75k) to contact him.
